Course Description: This internship is a supervised work experience in a position within the industry of the student's Career and Technical Education program of study. This internship provides on-the-job experience and valuable industry networking. Students must provide their own transportation to their worksite. CO/PREREQUISITE: Advanced/Intermediate Course within Student's Program of Study

GRADE: 12 (minimum 16 years of age)

LENGTH: Year DVUSD High School CREDIT: 1.0

Course Objectives: Individual objectives will be developed based on student placement and program of study. These objectives will be documented in the student's training plan.

Grading Policy:

Students will be evaluated in cooperation with employers/supervisors/mentors.

The category breakdown of the semester grade is as follows:

20% = Employer/Supervisor/Mentor Evaluation Reports (quarterly)

20% = Training Plan Development, Tracking, & Fulfillment

20% = Weekly Activity/Hour Reports & Verification (minimum of <u>five</u> hours per week)

20% = Reflections (6 per semester)

10% = Scheduling and Completion of Quarterly Evaluation Visits

10% = Training Agreement

The student is responsible for knowing points earned in the course and keeping track of his/her grades. The grading scale is administered equally to all students in the course. Do not expect to receive a grade higher than that earned by your total points. There will be no "point adjustments" made for such things as "class participation" or other subjective factors.

PowerSchool and Canvas Access:
