

<u>Make-up Work Policy</u>: Upon return to class after an absence, a student has one school day for each day missed to make up work/test assigned during his/her absence regardless of the number of days absent. For example, if a student is absent on Thursday and Friday, he/she will have Monday and Tuesday of the following week to make up

work and must turn in the work that was assigned during the days absent on Wednesday. It is the student's responsibility to check with Canvas and teacher as soon as possible for work missed and possible adjustment of due dates. All work is due by the end of the unit, prior to the unit exam. Work not turned in on the due date will be marked with a 0%. Once work has been turned in due to absence or lateness, the assignment will be scored as normal and the 0% will be removed. \*
