## **ARTICLE VIII: ACTIVITIES**

- Section 1. The chapter shall determine one or more service projects for the year.
- Section 2. All members shall regularly participate in these projects.
- Section 3. These projects shall have the following characteristics: fulfill a need within the school or community, have the support of the administration and the faculty, be appropriate and educationally defensible, and be well planned, organized, and executed.
- Section 4. Each member shall have the responsibility of choosing and participating in an individual service project which reflects his or her particular talents and interests and must be approved by the chapter advisor. To maintain active membership, members need to perform a minimum of 12 independent service hours a year. This is in addition to the chapter projects to which all members contribute. If these hours are not completed by the member within the time frame given by the advisor, their membership will be terminated.
